EMERGENCY MEDICAL PROCEDURE

From time to time, medical attention is required to treat illnesses or accidents. When possible, an emergency medical technician is included as an adult leader on the Tour to administer first aid treatment or to secure more appropriate medical assistance if needed. A registered nurse, hired by the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association (NRECA) Youth Tour program, is on duty at the hotel in Washington, D.C. Arrangements for emergency medical attention have been made at a nearby hospital. A physician has been retained to make "house calls" at the hotel. The doctor can treat minor emergencies and write prescriptions, thereby eliminating trips to the emergency room.

When a youth requires medical attention, a chaperone accompanies the student to the nurse on duty or to the hospital. If the youth is under 18 years of age, the hospital is required to contact a parent or legal guardian in order to obtain permission to render assistance. If an adult cannot be reached, the hospital obtains legal permission from a local judge (this is a common practice and is not an arduous procedure). The signed Parent's Consent Form provides immediate access to medical attention, but the telephone call is still made.

The Youth Tour insurance is for medical expenses pertaining to accidents (sprains, broken bones, head injuries, etc.), and colds, flu and diseases occurring during the Tour. It is important that the names of your family's insurance company and policy number are included on the Personal Data Form. Parents or guardians of participants are liable for medical expenses incurred which are not covered by the Tour's insurance policy.

If a youth experiences an accident or illness that may cause a need for being incapacitated for a lengthy period, the Tour Director will notify the parents/legal guardians to discuss the incident. If appropriate, arrangements for transportation home will be made, with travel reimbursement due New Mexico Rural Electric Cooperative Association, Inc.

Youth Tour participants should report any illness immediately to a chaperone. Often we can "nip an ailment in the bud" with early treatment.

COMMON SENSE

We have only a few guidelines for our Youth Tour, but they're important to ensure everything runs smoothly. Here are some reminders:

- Guideline 1: Be punctual for all appointments. Try not to be the reason for delays.
- **Guideline 2:** Report any damage in your hotel room immediately to the Tour Director. Provide the room number so they can notify the hotel management.
- Guideline 3: Enjoy souvenirs but keep them out of the hotel rooms. Do not take anything from your assigned room that belongs to the hotel or others.

- **Guideline 4:** Be considerate and avoid causing embarrassment. Socialize in common areas like hallways or the pool, not in other people's rooms.
- **Guideline 5:** Always travel in groups of at least three, especially in Washington, D.C. Never leave the group without informing your chaperones first.
- **Guideline 6:** Double-check your room before checking out to make sure nothing is left behind. Once we've left, we cannot return for forgotten items.
- Guideline 7: Keep track of your purse or wallet at all times. Carry your money securely to prevent loss or theft. If needed, your chaperones can hold some of your money for you.
- **Guideline 8:** Boys, please assist with carrying heavy luggage. Ensure your suitcases weigh less than 50 pounds each and pack only what you can handle in one trip.
- Guideline 9: If you're unsure about anything, ASK! Any additional details not covered here will be addressed in our orientation meeting. Prepare your questions so we can resolve any issues and focus on having fun.

YOUTH TOUR CODE OF CONDUCT

Here are the rules for our Youth Tour program:

- Substances and Weapons: Youth Tour participants are not allowed to possess or use alcohol, drugs, tobacco, or any weapons (including firearms, fireworks, knives, etc.).
- Respect: All Youth Tour participants must be attentive, respectful, and courteous to fellow participants, chaperones, staff, and speakers. Always consider the rights and feelings of others.
- Nametags: Youth Tour participants must wear their nametags at all times unless directed otherwise by staff or chaperones.
- Participation: Youth Tour participants should fully engage in all scheduled activities.

- Property Care: Handle both public and private property with care and respect at all times.
- **Hotel Rules:** After room checks, participants must stay in their assigned rooms until the next morning's first activity. Youth Tour participants are not allowed in rooms of the opposite sex.
- **Traveling:** Youth Tour participants must not leave the hotel without a chaperone and must travel in groups of three or more at all times. Solo travel is prohibited.
- **Sightseeing:** When sightseeing without direct supervision from a chaperone, Youth Tour participants must return to the designated meeting point by the time specified by the Youth Tour director.
- Safety Reporting: Report any dangerous activities or statements by other Youth Tour participants to the Youth Tour director immediately.
- Legal Compliance: Youth Tour participants who break local, state, or federal laws will be handed over to the appropriate legal authorities.
- **Dress Code:** Follow the dress code outlined in the initial correspondence from the Youth Tour director. Dresses, walking shorts, and skirts are allowed, provided they are no more than 3.5 inches above the knee. Short shorts are not permitted.
- Instructions: Adhere to all verbal instructions given by the Youth Tour director, staff, and chaperones.
- Consequences: Youth Tour participants who do not follow these rules may be sent home at the discretion of the Youth Tour director, with all associated costs being the responsibility of their parent(s) or guardian(s).

YOUTH LEADERSHIP COUNCIL

In 1976, the NRECA board of directors established the Youth Consulting Board (YCB). This board was restructured in 1998 and is now known as the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association (NRECA) Youth Leadership Council (YLC).

The YLC was created by rural electric cooperatives, state associations, and NRECA to enhance youth engagement within the Youth Tour program. Each participating state is entitled to one representative on the YLC. These representatives are chosen by statewide Youth Tour directors through various methods, and new YLC members are announced annually during the Youth Day program in Washington, D.C.

The YLC aims to develop participants' leadership and presentation skills and provide a deeper understanding of rural electric cooperatives. YLC members attend the NRECA Youth Leadership Conference and the NRECA Annual Meeting. Additionally, selected YLC members from host states present their Youth Tour experiences at NRECA Regional meetings.

The NRECA Youth Leadership Conference, held each summer after the Youth Tour, features hands-on activities that promote individual leadership development. Participants choose a spokesperson to address the NRECA Annual Meeting and the upcoming Youth Tour delegates.

The NRECA Annual Meeting, which attracts over 13,000 rural electric members each year, is hosted in various major cities across the country. YLC members assist NRECA staff during the meeting, attend educational seminars, and engage in various programs. They have the opportunity to meet influential individuals, including elected officials, NRECA's board of directors, the CEO, and administrative staff.
